1. PCF Insight – Early Years SEND

Across parent carer forums families are consistently raising similar experiences around Early Years SEND. Common themes include difficulty finding clear information and knowing who to contact, long waits to access early support, services not feeling joined up across health, education and local services, challenges securing Early Years placements for children with SEND, and transitions into primary school being particularly difficult without an EHCP.

What we're doing: These shared insights are being used to inform ongoing discussions, highlight recurring patterns affecting families, and support conversations about improving early support.

2. Parent Carer Coffee Morning

Our next Parent Carer Coffee Morning will take place on 29 January. This will be a relaxed, informal session with no guest speakers, giving parent carers the opportunity to connect, unwind, and support one another through peer conversation. Thank you to everyone who attended the previous coffee morning with Claire Gurney and Sharon Hawkins and shared feedback so openly.

Halton Borough Council Updates

4. Summary from Recent Zoom

Some of the following information was shared in last week's newsletter following the parent/carer Zoom with Michaela Bridge and Kate Charlton. The update below reiterates key points and includes any additional detail or next steps that were not available at the time.

- SEND staffing and EHCP processes -A new Head of Service for SEND & Inclusion Kelly Carey will be starting on 2 March 2026. This role is expected to support greater consistency and oversight across SEND services and EHCP processes.
- Transport - The Home to School Transport consultation has closed. Concerns were raised about a lack of clarity around what happens next. This feedback has been shared, and work is underway to develop a clear timeline for future updates and communications. Consultation information remains available to view via this link

- School place planning - Clarification was provided following recent media reports. It was confirmed that no school closures are currently planned. The local authority is exploring how existing buildings may be used more effectively including as potential SEND provision.
- A Sensory Toolkit is planned to launch in February. There may still be opportunities for parents to trial the toolkit, with families contacted directly if this applies.
- A SEND monitoring inspection - is currently taking place as a follow-up to the previous inspection. This focuses on progress against agreed improvement actions rather than being a full re-inspection. Parents' views may be gathered through surveys or meetings, and a written outcome letter will be published once the process is complete.

Short Breaks - Feedback from Kate Charlton

- Further updates were shared on Short Breaks including current consultation events. Feedback from the parent carers has been shared with senior leaders with individual cases raised during the Zoom being followed up. Concerns around communication and clarity have been acknowledged.

Short Breaks Consultation - Small Grants (Have Your Say)

Short Breaks consultation and questionnaire is an opportunity to share views and help shape future support a zoom consultation will take place on the 29th of January (see link above) and their own event on the 3rd of March. The following updates relate to health services and support across Halton and may be relevant for families and carers.

5. School Immunisations – SEND Support

From January 2026, secondary school immunisations will be taking place in Halton, starting with catch-up sessions for Year 10 and 11. Additional SEND support is available to help children and young people access immunisations in a way that works for them. This includes easy-read information, social stories and tailored approaches.

Parents will receive a consent form via school (even if choosing to decline). If your child may need reasonable adjustments, it's encouraged to speak with the school in advance.

6. Mental Health Support Teams (MHST) Update

Mental Health Support Teams (MHST) will continue to roll out across Halton in 2026/27. With funding having been agreed which will bring MHST coverage in Halton up to 100%. This means more schools will be able to access early mental health and emotional wellbeing support for children and young people.

7. Neurodevelopmental Pathway (NDP) Meet & Greet Sessions

The Neurodevelopmental Pathway (NDP) team is offering 30-minute Meet & Greet appointments for families navigating the Autism and/or ADHD assessment pathways. These sessions give parents and carers the chance to: Talk through the Autism and ADHD pathways, Understand what to expect from assessments, Ask questions or raise concerns about their child's journey, Get signposting to local support, including ADDvanced Solutions and Family Hub services.

Other Information & Support

The following information highlights additional support and resources that families may find helpful. These sit alongside, but are separate from, the council and health updates shared above.

8. SENDIASS Drop-in Sessions

SENDIASS are running free drop-in advice sessions for families who are not currently open to the service. Open to families who have concerns about SEND (no diagnosis needed) being informal, with no appointment needed (20–30 minute conversations)

Drop-ins run during term time at:

- **Warrington Road Family Hub** – 3rd Friday of the month
- **Brookvale Family Hub** – last Friday of the month

9. Sensory Play Toolkit (External Resource)

This is a separate resource to the Sensory Toolkit referenced in the Halton Borough Council updates above. A free Sensory Play Toolkit is available online and may be helpful for families supporting children with SEND. Particularly those who benefit from sensory activities to support regulation, communication and play.

The toolkit includes simple practical ideas that can be used at home with everyday items, allowing families to choose what works best for their child.
